“Whispering” Bill Anderson has been writing and recording superb Country songs for almost forty years and is still going strong! You will find his name credited to many modern Country tunes, many of which have hit the top of the Country charts. A very skilled and talented individual, still “performing” on all fronts! This song has a clever “sub-text”, it seems to tell a story of a man planning to “do the dirty” – but in the final words you find out that he is a husband, planning a “Wild Weekend” with his wife!

It was the “sentiment”, as much as anything else that attracted me to this tune. That and the terrific introduction used on the original (which we managed to re-create, for our version. This song is a great fun tune, very useful in many ways – especially as the introduction to a Square Dance weekend!

### **Where, When and Who produced the music:**

This was part of the second group of releases on Sting that were recorded in Nashville. A total of nine songs were recorded during this session, which was the last session to be arranged and produced by Stefan Sidholm and Ingvar Pettersson.

Recorded in late 1994, the music featured the top session musicians in Nashville. These included: Gregg Galbraith – who acts as band leader - on guitars, Terry McMillan on Harmonica and percussion, Doug Jernigan on Steel and Dobro, Jerry Kroon on Drums, Roger Morris on Piano and keyboards with Rob Hojacos on fiddle, David Smith on Bass Guitar and Bruce Watkins on Rhythm Guitar / Banjo / Mandolin. Also worthy of special mention is our engineer on these sessions – also the studio owner – Kevin McManus.
