This track came from the Phil Collins album "Testify". It was released as a single in November 2002 and hit the No.1 spot on the AC Radio Chart, in the U.S.A. It has a clever musical style, which is obviously an element of Phil's more recent work. An enchanting melody with great music!

We tried to follow the original on this as much as possible, whilst *significantly* altering the structure of the song to fit the Square Dance requirements. The final result is a good compromise – perhaps even raising the tune to a new level? I hope you agree... Robert has one of the warmest voices amongst Square Dance Callers, he chose this song and provides a first-rate vocal, perhaps upstaging Phil Collins? However, Robert cannot beat Phil on the drums...!

Where, When and Who produced the music:

This was part of the eighth group of releases on Sting that were recorded in Nashville. A total of fourteen songs were recorded during this session, which was the third to be arranged and produced by Paul Bristow – following his purchase of the company. Also in attendance at this session were Recording Artist: Carsten Nielsen and Company Founder Ingvar Pettersson.

Recorded in November 2003, the music still features the top session musicians in Nashville, including: Gregg Galbraith – as band leader and plays all lead Guitars, Terry McMillan on Harmonica and percussion, Doug Jernigan on Steel and Dobro, Jerry Kroon on Drums, Roger Morris on Piano and Keyboards, with Fiddle by Rob Hojacos and (on the last four songs) "Hoot". David Smith plays on the Bass Guitar and Bruce Watkins plays on Rhythm Guitar / Banjo / Mandolin. Also worthy of special mention is our engineer on these sessions – the studio owner: Kevin McManus.
